DAY 1 - Monday, March, 28 2011 DEPART CHARLOTTE

We begin our journey by traveling to a gate-way city to join another group for our overseas flight to Amman, Jordan.

DAY 2 - Tuesday, March 29, 2011 ARRIVE AMMAN

This afternoon we will arrive in Amman. We will be met and loaded on our motor coach for our drive to Amman stopping by the Roman Theater for viewing. We check into our hotel for dinner and overnight.

DAY 3 - Wednesday March 30, 2011 PETRA

This morning we proceed to Jerash, one of the world's most beautifully preserved and restored Greco-Roman provincial cities. Continue north to the Brook Jabrok, where Jacob wrestled with the Lord. Then on to Madaba to see the ancient map. Stopping at Machareus where John Baptist was beheaded. Then head to Petra. Petra is one of the most scenic places in the world. Proceed by foot into this dream-like, unreal world: the "Rose-Red City" of Petra with its incredibly beautiful temples, carved into solid rock and forgotten for 500 years. Dinner and overnight in Petra.

DAY 4- Thursday March 31, 2011 PETRA/AMMAN

Petra is the Mount Seir and the Selah of the Old Testament. We will view the places of sacrifice, the old tombs dating back to 100 B.C., El Deir Monastery, the Tomb of Aaron and the royal palaces. As we board our motorcoach and take a panoramic ride of the outer environs of Petra. This is one of the 8th wonders of the ancient world. This afternoon we will head to Mt Nebo to view what Moses saw before his death. Continue to Amman for dinner and overnight.

DAY 5 - April 1, 2011 AMMAN/TIBERIAS

We depart early this morning for the Baptismal site on Jordan. We continue across the Allenby Bridge into Israel and arrive in Jericho to visit the Tel and ride Mt of Temptation Cable Car to top. We will visit Elisha Springs and Harrod's Springs and continue to Beit Shean. Later this afternoon we will enjoy baptism in the Jordan River. Tiberias for dinner and overnight.

DAY 6 - April 2, 2011 GALILEE

We'll start the day with a boat ride on the Sea of Galilee to Capernaum, then visit Tabgha and the Mount of Beatitudes. Stop at Nof Ginossar to view the New Testament boat found below the sea and to visit the kibbutz. Stopping by Bethsaida as we travel Northward around the Sea of Galilee. Then up the Hula Valley to Hazor, ruins of the powerful Canaanite city destroyed by Joshua and rebuilt by King Jabin and then by Solomon as a chariot city to command upper Galilee. We continue to the northern limits of Jesus' travel as we cross the River Hatzbani to Dan,

where we combine a nature walk beside the Upper Jordan with views of the ancient ruins, topped by the Israelite high place that supported a golden calf (I Kings 12). Then a short drive to Banias (Caesarea Philippi), dedicated to Pan the Greek god of pastures, flocks and shepherds; here Peter made his great profession of faith, recognition of Christ Jesus (Matthew 16). Driving along the foot of Mount Hermon, we ascend onto the Golan Plateau for a magnificent view of upper Israel. Return to the hotel for dinner and overnight.

DAY 7 - April 3, 2011 TIBERIAS/JERUSALEM

We leave Tiberias for Jerusalem, on the way visiting Nazareth, boyhood home of Jesus. We pass through Cana, where Jesus performed His first miracle, Visit Muhraka on Mount Carmel. In the afternoon we visit Caesarea on the Mediterranean, the Roman aqueduct and port, Crusader's Moat, and the famous Roman Theater. We pass through Tel Aviv on our way to Jaffa (Joppa), the city of Jonah, where Peter had his housetop experience at the home of Simon the Tanner (Acts 10). Proceed by way of the Aijalon Valley to Jerusalem for check-in and dinner at our hotel.

DAY 8 - April 4, 2011 JERUSALEM

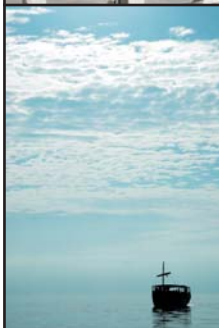
This morning we leave Jerusalem for Beersheba, ancient city of Judah, the southernmost area of our tour. Beersheba, a watering hole and trading post for thousands of years, is the center of desert traffic, being located on the edge of the vast Negev Desert. Here we catch a glimpse of Bedouin life.

This afternoon we visit the ancient cities of Ashkelon and Ashdod. Ashkelon was an important caravan stop in ancient days; there Delilah snipped Samson's hair. (Zorah Hill-Samsons grave) Today it is a popular resort area for modern Israel. Continue to Ashdod, a smaller and newer city and home of the Israeli Navy nautical school. Leaving Ashdod we pass through the Region of Adullom, where David took refuge from Saul, and on to the Valley of Elah, the site of David's conquest of the giant Goliath. On our return to Jerusalem we stop at Emmaus, where Jesus appeared to two disciples and walked with them. Continue to our hotel in Jerusalem for dinner and overnight.

DAY 9 - April 5, 2011 JERUSALEM

We start the day with an orientation to Jerusalem from the Mt. of Olives. We then walk the traditional Palm Sunday route to the church known as Dominus Flevit ("Our Lord weeps"). After viewing the Golden Gate, we walk downhill to Gethsemane, where we take time to meditate on the Gospel text. Boarding our bus we drive to the Dung Gate just inside we walk to the Southern Wall excavations. We then examine the ruins near the south side of the Temple complex,

including steps where we may be certain that Jesus and the disciples walked, We will continue to the Temple Institute where we will see the making of the instruments for the new temple. We will see how they are following the Bible for exact instructions. We will see a film explaining where the Rabbi believes the Ark of the Covenant is found then to the slopes of Mt. Zion there we will visit the Upper Room and King David's Tomb.

We go to the Shepherds' Fields at the YMCA. We conclude the day with a visit in Bethlehem, walking through its alleys and markets to the Church of the Nativity. Jerusalem for dinner and overnight.

DAY 10 – April 6, 2011 JERUSALEM

After breakfast we transfer to the Dung Gate, we walk up to the Western Wall Judaism's holiest site. We ascend to the Dome of the Rock and the al-Aqsa Mosque, the third holiest site of Islam, located on the traditional site of the ancient Temple Mount. It is believed that here is where the Temple once stood. Visit Herod's Antonia Fortress where Jesus was brought before Pontius Pilate (Luke 23: 1 - 11) Just to the north we find the Pools of Bethesda (John 5) and St. Anne's Church, the church is perfectly preserved from the Crusader period – with remarkable acoustics.

This afternoon exit the Old City at Mt Zion to the grounds of a church called Peter in Gallicantu, which affords the best view of early Jerusalem from the west. (Here, the Assumptionist Fathers suggest, was the house where the High Priest Caiaphas interrogated Jesus.). From there we board our bus and transfer to the Garden Tomb where we will end our day with a special visit and private communion on the grounds outside the city walls before transferring to the Allenby Bridge to cross back into Jordan. Dinner and overnight at our hotel.

DAY 11 Thursday, April 7, 2011 ARRIVE HOME

We arrive back in the USA today, our hearts filled with many fond memories of this Journey of a Lifetime.

Jonna and I would like to invite you to join us on a trip of a lifetime that we are sure you will never forget! After previous travels to the Holyland, Egypt, and the Sinai regions, we have had kindled in our hearts a fire of excitement like never before in serving the Lord. Walking where Jesus Christ walked will make the scriptures come alive to you in a way that will forever change how you view all of those precious bible stories.



You will be surprised to discover just how much of biblical history happened in the country of Jordan. Going on this journey, you will cruise in a ship on the Sea of Galilee, go to Nazareth where Christ grew up into manhood, visit the many Roman structures that have stood for over 2000 years, see the Temple Mount, and the place of the Skull (Golgotha) while viewing the empty tomb in Jerusalem along with many other famous biblical places! SAVINGS: Early registration discounts are not available to Hosts/Co-Hosts and are deducted from the balance of your bill. An additional \$40 Savings available if full payment is received via check 4 months prior to departure.

ACCOMMODATIONS: Price is based on double occupancy. When available, single rooms are often smaller than doubles. While EOT will try to match roommates, EOT cannot guarantee a roommate will be available. Roommates may be assigned as late as 35 days prior to departure and, if one is not available or you request a single room, the following charges apply: \$550 during the tour.

ITINERARY CHANGES: If itinerary changes necessitate extra overnights, you will be charged \$90 per night; single rooms \$150 per night. Meals for extra nights are not included.

CANCELLATION FEES: 100% of Cancellation Fees are covered by the optional Travel Protection Program provided premium has been paid and reason for cancellation is insurable.
